IDENTITY CLARK COUNTY ACCEPTING NOMINATIONS FOR 2026 ED LYNCH HONORARY BOARD SEAT

VANCOUVER, **Wash**. – (September 29, 2025) – One aspiring businessperson will have a unique opportunity to serve for a year alongside the region's most accomplished business leaders.

The nonprofit business leaders group Identity Clark County is seeking its tenth honoree for the Ed Lynch board seat, a one-year courtesy role for an emerging business leader which honors the late businessman and philanthropist Edward Lynch who chaired the group for more than a decade.
